• BELLOC, ANNE LOUISE, born at Rochelle on the 1st October, 1796. Being the daughter of an Irish officer of the name of Swanston, she was naturally as familiar with the English language as with that of her native land, and possessing taste and learning, she has devoted herself to giving to her own country much of the literature of ours, through the medium of translation. Amongst others she has translated the poetry of Moore, and the Vicar of Wakefield of Goldsmith, as well as many of the tales of Miss Edgeworth, and the travels of the Lauders; one of her latest works is a translation of Mrs. Beecher Stowe's Uncle Tom's Cabin.—J.
